November 18, 2021 – Washington, DC – The Association of University Programs in Health Administration (AUPHA) is pleased to announce the *Quint Studer Prize for Teaching Excellence*. This prize, established by AUPHA and endowed by Quint Studer, will be presented at AUPHA's 2022 Annual Meeting, scheduled to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah, June $7^{th} - 9^{th}$. Information on the process for nomination and selection will be forthcoming.

Quint Studer has spent decades in healthcare. He serves on several healthcare boards and is a frequent speaker, workshop facilitator, and mentor to individuals and organizations. His newest book, *The Calling: Why Healthcare Is So Special*, is aimed at helping healthcare professionals keep their sense of passion and purpose high.

"For as long as I've known Quint, which has been several decades, regardless of the formal roles he's had as hospital COO and CEO, Founder of the Studer Group, and now Founder and Owner of a Minor League Baseball team and the Studer Community Institute, he has always described himself as a teacher, mentor, and coach," said Dan Gentry, PhD, MHA, President and CEO of AUPHA.
